

Notary Publics: Your Guide to What They Can and Cannot Do

You've just been told that you must have a document notarized. Okay, you think, but you can't get to the notary right then, so you sign it and send someone else to get it stamped. After all, everybody in town knows you.

Not so fast. A document that is not signed in the presence of a Notary is invalid. Your paperwork will have no legal standing, and the Notary will be performing an act which could result in her/his loss of commission and possible criminal prosecution.

The Blauvelt Free Library offers no-cost

notary services to our patrons. Both of our Reference Librarians - Tonie D'Angelo and Alex Carver - are commissioned by NY State as notaries, and both have encountered patrons who could benefit from knowing what notaries can and cannot legally do.

According to Alex, the number one problem that Notaries face is being asked to notarize a document that is already signed. In such a case, the (continued on back page)

BULLETIN Library Renovation

The Blauvelt Free Library expects our multi-phase renovation project to begin in June and take between nine months to a year to complete. The project's four phases include:

- 1) Elevator Quiet Study Porch
- 2) Temporary stairs and partitions . Demo of existing stairs, Director's office, circulation desk · Construction of new porch, entrance, book-drop, staff toilet, kitchenette · Installation of circulation area, stairs to basement and second floor, second floor office suite and storage room
- 3) Demo and removal of temporary stair. existing Children's Room toilet and storage Installation of steel girder in Children's Room . Construction of new Story/Craft Annex . Completion of second floor toilet
- 4) Installation of new entry walkway and ramp, concrete curb and patching of asphalt . Installation of electric generator Landscaping



Notary's only legal authority is nullified. Other things to consider:

- When verbiage implies both parties need be present at the same time, the Notary cannot stamp the signature of a single party – both must appear
- Notaries who believe they are not capable of assessing the requirements of a foreign document may have to turn the bearer away
- "Notarized copies" are not a recognized entity in NY State. Notaries have no legal power to assess the authenticity of copies of official documents. Even so, people are often sent in search of these mythical articles. The confusion stems from differences in notary laws among states.
- Many people misunderstand the limits of a Notary's power and knowledge. Notaries are barred from giving any legal advice.
 Nevertheless, people will ask the Notary's "personal opinion," about whether or not signing a given document is a good idea.
 This is a question for an attorney.
- Notarizing a Will in New York State depends on certain parameters as to whether a Notary or attorney is required. Call first and check with Alex.
