## Harper Lee's *To Kill a Mockingbird* Book • Blockbuster • Broadway

### A Three-Chapter Friends Event • Summer to Fall 2019

When it was released in 1960, Harper Lee's novel, *To Kill a Mockingbird* proved a phenomenon. Set in the depression-era South, the tale about a crisis of conscience in a sleepy rural town is one of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century's most important works. Winner of the 1961 Pulitzer Prize for Literature, it was adapted as an acclaimed Hollywood film in 1962, featuring an Oscar-winning performance by Gregory Peck as Atticus Finch, a lawyer who takes on racial prejudice in the cause of justice.

A new theatrical production with Jeff Daniels at Broadway's Schubert Theatre offers a rare opportunity for fans of the arts to compare a classic story in three media. Join the *Friends of the Blauvelt Free Library* on a cultural journey from the *Book to the Blockbuster to the Broadway Show*.
