However, we want to preserve your health (and ours), so we recommend using only the EXTRA SMALL box from Home Depot (15"×12"×10"). We will supply you with flattened boxes if you like. Use packing or duct tape on the wide seam under the box to keep books from dropping through, and do fill it to the top, but not so high that it cannot be closed without the top flaps arching. This helps support transport and stacking.


